Good morning Dawn,

I have reviewed both Inspire North and Winship Community's 2nd interim alternative forms. Overall, both charters appear to be in a much more fiscally sound position than in years past. My notes for each are below.

Winship Community

- There was a decrease of 34% in Other State Revenues. Not sure what attributed to this decrease.
- They have budgeted a decrease of 64% in 4xxx's and 69% in 5xxx's. Is this due to the reallocation of expenditures between Inspire charters?
- There is a new budget for depreciation expense in the amount of \$17,232.
- They are projected to have an Unrestricted EFB of \$57,937 ☺
- They are projecting an increase of ADA in 20/21 and 21/22 to 139.16
- Revenues and Expenditures appear to be reasonable in the MYP for the increase in ADA.
- They are projecting EFB in 20/21 to be \$148,423 and in 21/22 to be \$226,754 ☺

Inspire North

- There was a decrease of 43% in Other State Revenues. Not sure what attributed to this decrease.
- 38% decrease in Certificated Staff
- New Classified salaries added at 2nd interim (\$115,523). No classified salaries were budgeted at 1st interim
- 66% increase in health & welfare
- 95% decrease in OPEB (39xx)
- 53% decrease in 4xxx's and 59% decrease in 5xxx's
- 75% decrease in depreciation expense
- 50% decrease in debt service interest
- Are the adjustments in 1xxx-7xxx due to the reallocation between other Inspire charters?
- Projecting an Unrestricted EFB of \$405,181 @ and able to set aside a reserve of \$327,463 @
- Projecting no increase in ADA for 20/21 or 21/22
- Revenue increases projected according to LCFF Calculator
- Reasonable increases to all expenditures in out years of MYP
- Projecting positive EFB in 20/21 of \$531,848 and in 21/22 of \$867,915, with a healthy reserve budgeted in both years as well

Please let me know if you have any questions. It definitely appears that they are making positive changes!
